Monroe Canyon, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 3). Three miles east of Monroe, UT. Timber. Active fire behavior with running, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Deer Creek, Southeast Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 4). Twenty-five miles southeast of Moab, UT. Timber, chaparral and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and wind-driven runs. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

White Sage, Arizona Strip District, BLM. CIMT (GB Team 6). Fifteen miles southeast of Fredonia, AZ. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, wind-driven runs and short crown runs. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Forsyth, Dixie NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2). Thirty miles north of St. George, UT. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with torching, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hot Canyon, Elko District, BLM. Ten miles northwest of Montello, NV. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Cornucopia, Elko District, BLM. Sixteen miles north of Tuscarora, NV. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

* **Buckboard**, Idaho Falls District, BLM. Started on private land ten miles southwest of Malad, ID. Grass, brush and dormant brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Gothic, Nellis Air Force Base, DOD. Previously reported incident. Twenty-five miles southwest of Rachel, NV. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with group torching, running and flanking. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Cram, Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Fifteen miles north of Madras, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and isolated torching. Residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Hope, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 8). Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Elk, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Hagelstein incident. Seven miles southwest of Beatty, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and single tree torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Hagelstein, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. Four miles southeast of Modoc Point, OR. Timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with flanking, single tree torching and spotting. Area and road closures in effect. Energy infrastructure threatened.

Pomas, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Grass, timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grizzly Complex, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 3). Twenty miles west of Medford, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Several communities threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Western Pines, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 10 miles north of Davenport, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and uphill runs. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Highland, Prineville District, BLM. Started on private land one mile south of Prineville, OR. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, isolated torching and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Boundary Road, Yakima Agency, BIA. Thirty miles southeast of Toppenish, WA. Grass and brush. No new information.

Daybreak, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles north of Huntington, OR. Grass and brush. No new information.

Greenacres, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on county land five miles north of Omak, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

* **Columbia River Cutoff**, Colville Agency, BIA. One mile south of Omak, WA. Grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and smoldering. Community of Omak threatened.

Active fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire yesterday.

Himalaya Road, Fairbanks Area, Alaska DOF. CIMT (RM Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Aggie Creek incident. Started on Alaska DNR land 12 miles northwest of Fox, AK. Chaparral and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Numerous residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Aggie Creek, Fairbanks Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land 23 miles northwest of Fairbanks, AK. Chaparral and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

Seven Mile Lookout, Tok Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land seven miles southwest of Tok, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, group torching and short crown runs. Residences threatened.

Tsukon, Upper Yukon Zone, BLM. Started on Alaska Native Corporation land 17 miles northwest of Venetie, AK. Closed timber litter and brush. No new information. Last report unless new information is received

Christian, Upper Yukon Zone, BLM. Started on FWS land 50 miles northeast of Venetie, AK. Timber and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and single tree torching. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Fire weather concerns will begin to increase from the northern Sierra and Cascades into the northern Great Basin. A band of stronger westerly winds aloft will result in breezy, dry and hotter conditions east of the Cascades, with west wind gusts reaching 25-35 mph through the Cascade gaps, and downslope wind gusts locally as high as 45-50 mph into parts of Idaho and western Wyoming. This may allow for lightning holdovers to emerge and grow. RH west of the Divide and east of the Cascades will drop to 10-20%, locally lower in Nevada, with temperatures warming back into the 90s and low 100s in lower elevations. Temperatures west of the Cascades will not be as hot but will still be a good 5-10 degrees above average. Isolated dry thunderstorms could pop up over southern Oregon into northern California and the Sierra Front, while a few mixed wet/dry storms are possible throughout the southern half of the Great Basin. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected to increase over the mountains and deserts of Southern California as an upper low draws deeper monsoonal moisture north and west into the area.

A backdoor front settling into Colorado and New Mexico will help monsoonal moisture pool over the Four Corners, with scattered to numerous wet thunderstorms capable of producing localized flash flooding becoming likely from central and northern Arizona into most of New Mexico and southern Colorado. Thicker clouds may lead to a decrease in thunderstorm coverage over the West Slope relative to the previous few days. Showers and thunderstorms will extend along this front into the Great Lakes and Northeast, as well.

The disturbance being monitored by the National Hurricane Center is forecast to continue tracking west along the Gulf Coast, resulting in a likely increase in flash flooding for parts of coastal Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama. Unsettled weather will persist with some of its outer bands across the Florida peninsula, while most of the interior Southeast and Southern Plains will be hot and dry.
