Predictive Services Discussion:

A dry cold front will move through the central Plains today, with breezy and dry northern winds gusting to 30 mph behind the front over northeast Colorado, Nebraska, and Kansas. Breezy and dry southerly winds will develop ahead of the front across central and western Oklahoma and Texas, as well. Hot, well above normal temperatures to 110°F will continue across much of the lower elevations of California into the southern Great Basin and Southwest. Very low afternoon relative humidity below 15% and very poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges will continue. Warm and dry conditions will continue across the Inland Northwest into the northern Great Basin and northern Rockies, but winds will be lighter today. Drier conditions are expected across the Appalachians to the East Coast, with dry conditions continuing in the Great Lakes.
