Predictive Services Discussion:

Strong southwest winds of 20-30 mph are expected in central New Mexico into West Texas, with strong southerly winds in the central High Plains from eastern Colorado and western Kansas into South Dakota. Minimum relative humidity will fall to 5-20% in this corridor with widespread elevated to critical conditions. Areas of low relative humidity of 15-30% are likely to continue in the Appalachians and Piedmont today, as well, but winds will be lighter. Light showers are expected in the Lower Mississippi Valley today, while a strong storm continues across much of the West. Widespread valley rain and mountain snow are expected in the West, with heavy snow likely in the mountains above 5,000 feet, especially in California, Nevada, Utah, and Arizona. Near normal temperatures will continue in Alaska today, while dry trade winds continue to diminish in Hawai'i.
